The Eyre Peninsula covers a fascinating part of South Australia stretching south and west from Port Augusta to Port Lincoln to Streaky Bay and beyond.

The Eyre Peninsula has so much diverse scenery in its spectacular landscape and with the comfort of travelling on our spacious chartered coach you are provided with a perspective unlike any other. Our specially crafted itinerary of the Eyre Peninsula insights will leave you with an unforgettable experience. Let the adventure begin . . .

Day 1

Tuesday 11th June – arrive Adelaide

Check-in from 2pm at our hotel located in central Adelaide.

Overnight at the Vibe Hotel, Flinders Street, Adelaide

Day 2

Wednesday 12th June – Adelaide to Port Augusta



After breakfast we board our coach for our first insight of the tour at Moonta. This historic, fabulously rich copper mining town has strong Cornish heritage which we will discover during our chartered train tour of the Moonta Mines Museum. North from Moonta we pass the southern flanks of the Flinders Ranges as we head towards the top of Spencer Gulf and the Arid Lands Botanic Gardens at Port Augusta. Our guides there will inform us of the significance of the arid land plants during our walking tour of the garden. Overnight at the Standpipe Hotel

Day 3

Thursday 13th June – Port Augusta to Whyalla

Our coach takes us to Iron Knob the town which lays claim to being the first iron-ore source for the Whyalla Steelworks. We'll stop in Iron Knob and see the town, the mine-site and museum. Next we travel south to the regional city of Whyalla where we board our chartered glass-bottom vessel to see the Giant Cuttlefish Conglomeration; the only place where these creatures congregate in such huge numbers; upward of 250,000. Our tour is timed to give us the best chance of seeing these unusual creatures which have the ability to change shape and colour during their breeding season.

After lunch in Whyalla we visit Hummock Hill Lookout to see where Finders and Baudin both sailed in the early 1800's and a great vantage point to view the expansive port and steelworks. Whyalla's Maritime Museum is our next point of interest and a specially arranged guided tour will reveal Whyalla's shipbuilding history. There will also be time to explore the museum's excellent collections of aboriginal and early maritime history.

Overnight at the Sundowner Hotel

Day 4

Friday 14th June – Whyalla to Port Lincoln

As we leave the arid landscapes around Whyalla and travel south we enter the vast cropping region of Eyre Peninsula. At Arno Bay our local biologist guide will lead us on a walking tour of the Mangrove Boardwalk. We will lunch at Tumby Bay then head inland to the Cummins Flour Mill - only Eyre Peninsula-grown grains are milled - for a myriad of products. We have a specially arranged guided tour before continuing to Port Lincoln located on Boston Bay where we stay 2 nights at the Port Lincoln Hotel.

Day 5

Saturday 15th June – Port Lincoln

After breakfast we board our chartered vessel for a cruise on Boston Bay. Our skipper will explain about the aquaculture industries and there'll be some tastings of the freshest of local products. Winter's Hill Lookout affords an expansive viewpoint over Port Lincoln which we will visit before lunch at L'Anse; a local café with a French chef. Our afternoon insights include Boston Bay Winery for tastings and the Eyre Peninsula Railway Museum located in the imposing 2 storey railway station.

Day 6

Sunday 16th June – Port Lincoln to Streaky Bay

This morning we head north along the remote west coast of the Eyre Peninsula. Our first insight for today is a visit to the Reconciliation Monument at Elliston, located cliff-side of the dramatic coastline. Lunch is at Venus Bay Hotel.

Near Streaky Bay we'll explore the spectacular Whistling Rocks coastline with a boardwalk stroll to several vantage points. At Streaky Bay we have a private tour and tasting with a local abalone diver and his family. They will showcase their own-brand export abalone as well as local oysters and wine. Overnight at Streaky Bay Hotel Motel

Day 7

Monday 17th June – Streaky Bay to Port Augusta

After breakfast we head to the northern region of the Eyre Peninsula to Pildappa Rock. Time to enjoy your choice of several short walks either near the base or to a vantage point. We enjoy our lunch at the town of Kimba - visit its alluring silo art. Watch out for the setting sun casting its hues and palettes on the landscape as we travel to Port Augusta.

Overnight at the Standpipe Hotel, Port Augusta

Day 8

Tuesday 18th June – Port Augusta to Adelaide

We transfer to Port Augusta Railway Station to board our chartered heritage railcar for



the scenic climb through the Pichi Richi Pass to Quorn; - headquarters of the Pichi Richi Railway. Then by our coach travelling along the eastern ramparts of the Southern Flinders Ranges towards Crystal Brook and to our next destination - the historic port town of Wallaroo. A guided tour will inform us of the mining, agricultural and maritime heritage of Wallaroo. After lunch at the Weeroona hotel we re-board our coach for Adelaide where we plan to arrive in the late afternoon.

Overnight at the Vibe Hotel, Adelaide

Day 9

Wednesday 19th June - depart Adelaide

The tour concludes after breakfast. Check out by 11am.

The cost of this tour is \$4,995 AUD.

Train

Insights Tours has arranged the exclusive charter of a one carriage railcar from the Pichi Richi Railway. The railcar is pictured in this brochure. It is a heritage railcar which was designed and operated on regional SA services. Guest numbers will be limited to 22 to ensure a spacious and enjoyable experience. For your comfort there is a toilet on board and opening windows.

Coach

Insights Tours has chartered an air-conditioned, 46 seat coach for all road travel and transfers. Guest numbers will be limited to 22 ensuring a spacious and comfortable travelling experience.

Luggage

Please limit your luggage to one suitcase and one piece of hand luggage per person. All guests must accept responsibility for manoeuvring their luggage.

Travel to and from Adelaide

Travel to and from Adelaide is not included in the tariff however if you would like any assistance with booking or ticketing your air, train or coach travel, please contact us.

Health and fitness to travel

This tour involves numerous short walking sectors during guided tours and short excursions. We recommend that guests be able to walk for up to a total of 2kms per day in sectors of up to 500m over various surfaces eg paved and uneven, unpaved surfaces, and boardwalks.

At a Quorn it will be necessary to alight the train utilising secure, portable steps.

If you or a travelling companion have a condition which may or does require any assistance or accessibility requirements, please contact us prior to booking as a medical questionnaire will be required to be completed and assessed before your booking can be accepted. It is a condition of booking that guests agree to comply with all health and safety related
